

2017: The **Indians** entered last season with realistic goals and, with a **4-3 region record** and 4th place finish, the Indians 4-7 season record was less than they hoped for.

Loading up the early portion of the schedule was designed to toughen the Indians through **trial by fire**, and the Indians struggles were not without some bright points. Losses to tough opponents, Fort Payne (28-30) and Dawson County (14-29) and Ridgeland (7-38) left the Indians 0-3 but **battle tested**. A heartbreaking double-overtime loss to Coosa (37-38) left the Indians with an uphill journey in Region 7AA. .

A **blowout 40-0 win** over Gordon Central reminded the Indians of their potential before an equally painful loss to Rockmart served as a reminder that **nothing in 7-AA would come without a fight.**

Three straight WINS, over region foes secured Chattooga a playoff berth before a showdown with Pepperell.

Rabun County ended the Indians season in the first round of the **GHSA Playoffs** and Chattooga **looks forward to 2018.**

2017 CHATTOOGA FOOTBALL

Region Play: While the Indians struggled against the top two teams in the region, they played better than a 4-3 team.

Scoring— the Indians outscored all Region foes **174-164** and gave up half of those points (86) to Rockmart and Pepperell. Chattooga went **4-1** against the other five region opponents, **167-78**, with the only loss being a single point, double overtime defeat.

Young Stars— E.J. Lackey's freshman campaign was nothing short of spectacular. Lackey led the team in carries (**93**), yards (**653**), average (**7.0**), and rushing TD's (**6**).

Veteran Depth- Chattooga returns their top two quarterbacks in **Devin Price** and **Clayton Johnson**, four of their top five rushers and their top receiver.

200—yards rushing per game in 2017. While above the national average, the ground game won't be enough if the Indians want to move above the #4 spot in the region.







Season 7 of the **Coach Hammon Indians**, and the leadership positions are stocked with highly qualified coaches.

A seasoned offensive line and a **powerful defensive front** will be leaned on heavily to navigate through **new waters** and plenty of change for the Indians.

Returning **playmakers** on both sides of the ball should play a big factor, while the Indians will need some **new stars** to show quick maturity in **big situations. Senior leadership** on the field will come from both sides of the ball, as the Indians look to continue their 4-year streak of playoff appearances.





Seniors Clayton Johnson and Devin Price lead an offense with plenty of talent and even more battle scars. The Indians have veteran offensive lineman and, while replacing the

> mountain known as **Dustin Pope**, Chattooga will rely on the brains of **Devon Blackmon** at center and the nearly 300lbs of bruiser **Grayson Edgeman** to protect the passer and clear running lanes.

> The Indians will again rely heavy on the run with sophomore E.J. Lackey after a stunning freshman campaign, but don't be surprised to get heavy doses of power fullback Izzy Dammond in all situations. Look for Johnson and Price to mix things up in the backfield as both seniors are stellar at the QB and Receiver positions.

Keep your eyes on #6. Freshman sensation, Leshaun Lester has been destroying defenses since he could walk. The 210 lb running-back plans on making an instant impact.




The era of Medina is upon Chattooga. The 6'2" 280lb defensive is a **D-1 level athlete** with agility and power. His speed and guickness should set the edge while seniors Jackson Lowenberg and Malachi Mack will be delivering **bone-crunching hits** as outside linebackers.

The secondary will be anchored by seniors **Danny Bare** and Tre' Flowers at corners with speedster Jamarious Mosteller at safety. Expect more magic from the wrestling mat as grapplers Ty Veatch and Jakoby Cottrell provide run-stopping support in the linebacker positions.

The 2018 season will need a **strong defense**. All the components are in place. Big plays from small players will be needed. Look to 150lb Baylor Wilson, the explosive nose guard, to disrupt backfields and create turnovers.




Chattooga's kicking game will rely heavily on the powerful leg of junior kicker, Luis Medina.

Freshman Caroline Hodges has been a significant addition to the line up. Spending every practice putting her leg to work, Hodges should add much-needed depth to the kicking position.

Punting duties fall to the 6'5" sophomore Cash Allen. The lanky athlete has a booming leg and can flip the field in crunch situations.

Kick/Punt Return duties will be split between veterans Devin Price, Jamarious Mosteller and Timyus Lawrence but don't be surprised to see several faces as coaches search for anyone to bring a spark to the special teams unit.







JIMMY LENDERMAN

SUPERINTENDENT



After 27 years of service in the United States Marine Corps, Colonel Jimmy Lenderman came home to Chattooga County and found himself with a new mission.


Mr. Lenderman graduated from Chattooga High School in 1970, after earning his BA at Jacksonville State. a 22 year old Jimmy Lenderman traveled to Quantico, VA for Marine Corps officer candidate school. Completion of this rigorous training, Lenderman went to Pensacola to train as a pilot.

His Marine career is one that movies are made about. He was the youngest pilot to be selected to fly into Iran as part of the rescue mission, Operation Eagle Claw. He later was a pilot for Marine 1, flying President Ronald Reagan. Lenderman rose through the ranks of the Marine Corps and retired as a Colonel.

After retiring and a brief stint as a ROTC commander in North Carolina,

Colonel Lenderman came home, where duty called once again, with his hometown schools in need of leadership and vision, stepping into the role as vice principal at his alma mater Chattooga High School, Lenderman's military background immediately kicked in as he sought out problems and created solutions.



Senorise Perry is a former graduate of Chattooga High School who was recruited by several Division 1 football programs. Perry selected Louisville and spent his time there as a standout spe-

cial teams player and running back.

After a breakout junior season at Louisville, Perry found himself on several NFL teams' radar and, in spite of battling an injury and stiff competition at running back on his own team, Senorise was invited to camp by the Chicago Bears after graduating from Louisville. Perry's camp performance was stellar and when the preseason came along, Senorise's play on the field was as bright as his smile on the sideline. He won the coaches over and became one of the exceptional few undrafted rookies to make it to the final roster on an NFL team. In 2014 Perry led the Bears in special teams tackles with 17 and played on more than 60 percent of the team's special team snaps one of the highest numbers on the team.

Perry left the Bears and worked his way onto the roster of the Miami Dolphins where he again shined in special teams.

Perry earned his degree from the University of Louisville and is currently a player for the Miami Dolphins.

Jarod played in 42 games for the Tennessee Volunteers from 2003-2007 as a defensive back, safety and special teams player. He was named to the 2003 SEC Freshman Academic Honors Roll. Parrish got his first start in 2004 against Alabama and had a career high 7 tackles against Florida in 2007. Dr. Jarod Parrish went on to graduate and can now be found in Nashville, TN where he is the presiding Pharmacy Manager at Target.

As a Chattooga Indian: Parrish was ranked one of the top 50 Georgia prospects by Atlanta Journal-Constitution ... All-State honors as senior and All-North Georgia honors as junior and senior ... Two-year starter at quarterback and three-year starter at cornerback and safety ... Teams made playoffs each of his three years ... As senior, recorded 63 tackles and intercepted four passes ... Played as option quarterback in

addition to safety and rushed for more than 600 yards and 10 TDs ... Winning touchdown on 63-yard punt return against Coosa and two interceptions against Armuchee ... Scored 16 total touchdowns as junior on 700 yards receiving and 600 yards rushing ... Defensively, made 40 tackles and six interceptions ... Had .362 batting average in baseball as center fielder and was three-year starter.

Jeremiah Wilson is in his first season as the Mocs cornerbacks coach. He spent the previous five years working with the defense at Florida State.

Wilson joined the Seminoles in 2013 as a defensive quality control specialist for then-coordinator and current Tennessee head coach Jeremy Pruitt. After FSU won the national championship, Wilson stayed on as a defensive graduate assistant, while earning his Master's Degree in International Affairs. He worked for three years under current Tennessee special teams coordinator and safeties

coach Charles Kelley.

He primarily worked with the secondary and in recruiting at Florida State. The Seminoles signed a top-five class each year he was there, to go with two ACC titles and appearances in four other bowl games. While at FSU, Wilson worked with no less than six NFL Draft picks, highlighted by Jalen Ramsey, Lamarcus Joyner, Terrance Brooks, P.J. Williams and Derwin James.

Prior to his stint at Florida State, Wilson was an assistant coach at Amos Golby High School in Tallahassee, Fla., from 2010-12. There he helped the Cougars to the 2012 Florida 5A state championship while coaching the secondary, special teams and serving as the outgoing recruiting coordinator. He coached eight de-
