INCIDENT NARRATIVE:

On 06-30-2020 I was dispatched to the area of Highway 67 and Tobacco Road for a suspicious vehicle in the woods.

Upon my arrival, another deputy had already spoke with the complainant Mr. Van Page. Mr. Page stated, he was walking his property when he looked over a saw a black motorcycle leaned up on a tree in the woods and it was covered with other trees as if someone was trying to hide the motorcycle.

The tag of the motorcycle was ran the GCIC and the registered owner was a Mr. Anthony Martinez, who lived on Fort Stewart in Liberty County. A Bulloch County Investigator contacted Liberty County to see if they would make contact with Mr. Martinez. Liberty County Sheriff's Office then contacted Fort Stewart Military Police. Neither the Fort Stewart Military Police and Liberty County Sheriff's Office did not make contact with Mr. Martinez.

I had Bulloch County dispatch contact Bobby Dollar's towing to have the motorcycle removed. Before Bobby Dollar arrived on scene, Mr. Gregory Scott arrived on scene stating, the motorcycle was his. Mr. Scott stated, he bought the motorcycle from a Mr. Martinez on Fort Stewart but could not provide any type of paperwork for ownership. Mr. Scott stated, when he was driving the motorcycle home the battery died and he hid it in the woods so no one stole the motorcycle. I then advised Mr. Scott that due to him not being able to provide me with a bill of sale and because the motorcycle was not registered to him then I still had to have the motorcycle towed. I advised Mr. Scott that he needed to bring the bill of sale to the Bulloch County Sheriff's Office so we could verify the motorcycle was sold to him. There was not a hold placed on the motorcycle but Bobby Dollar did say that Mr. Scott could not pick up the vehicle until he showed the Sheriff's Office a copy of the bill of sale. Bobby Dollar also said that Mr. Scott had to provide him with the bill of sale before the motorcycle could be released to him. Nothing further.
