INCIDENT NARRATIVE:

On 07-25-2020 I conducted a traffic stop at the En market on Highway 67 and the Bypass for the tag lights on the vehicle not working.

As I was approaching the vehicle I could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. When I got to the drivers window I spoke to the driver, Ms. Michelle Boyd. I explained to Ms. Boyd the reason why I stopped her and she said that she just fixed the lights but the lights were not working. I then told Ms. Boyd that I could smell the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle, and asked her if there was any in the vehicle. Ms. Boyd stated no, but she said that she had smoked a few hours ago. I then asked Ms. Boyd and the passenger Ms. Precious Tyson to step out of the vehicle and had them go to the front of my patrol car. I then explained to Ms. Boyd that I was going to conduct a probable cause search of the vehicle due to the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle.

I then started my search of the vehicle. I first started on the drivers side of the vehicle. When I was looking in the back seat, on the floor board of the drivers side, there was a peach cup that had ice and a liquid drink that had the odor of alcohol coming from it. I then moved to the passenger side of the vehicle. I started looking in the purse that Ms. Tyson was holding in her lap when I approached the car. While searching through the bag, in one of the small side pockets inside of the bag had a green leafy substance suspected to be marijuana. I continued my search and on the floor board of the passenger side there was a clear glove and in one of the fingers of the glove there was a white powder substance suspected to be cocaine. After finding what we were suspecting was cocaine, I detained both Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson and called for a drug investigator to the scene. I then asked Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson who the purse belonged to that had the substance that was suspected to be marijuana, Ms. Boyd stated that it was hers. I then asked them who's glove it was that had the suspected cocaine in it and both Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson stated that they did not know and did not know it was in the vehicle. I then continued to search the vehicle and there was a black gym bag in the passengers floor board and inside of the bag there was a half empty bottle of liquor.

After placing Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson in the back seat of my patrol car another deputy went behind me and looked in the black gym bag again and found a rolled up green leafy substance also suspected to be marijuana. Ms. Boyd had already told us that the black gym bag was hers. Both Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson wanted there phones debit cards and cash out of the vehicle and I placed them in clear evidence bags to take to the jail.

Statesboro Tire and Brake towed the vehicle. Ms. Boyd was charged with Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Marijuana Less than 1 Ounce, Tag Lights Required, and Open Container. Ms. Tyson was charged with Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Marijuana Less than 1 Ounce, and Open Container. Ms. Boyd and Ms. Tyson were transported to the Bulloch County Jail with no further issues.
