**INCIDENT NARRATIVE:**

On 07-22-2020 I was dispatched to 98 Dry Branch Village for a dispute between neighbors. While en route 911 Dispatch advised that Mr. James Spratlin and Ms. Rebecca Kline left the scene possibly going to downtown Statesboro.

Upon my arrival, I spoke with Ms. Amber Lowery. Ms. Lowery stated, she went to 93 Dry Branch Village to ask her roommate, Ms. Rebecca Kline, to come do her dishes that were dirty. Ms. Lowery said that an argument started between her and Ms. Kline. Ms. Lowery stated, Mr. Spratlin then got in the middle of it and pushed her off the porch of his residence. Ms. Lowery stated, she then got up and went to do the dishes herself when Mr. Spratlin entered the residence and pushed her again. She then said she was going to call law enforcement and that's when Ms. Kline and Mr. Spratlin left the scene.

Statesboro Police Department located that vehicle at the Exxon gas station on South Main and East Jones. I responded to the gas station to get Ms. Kline and Mr. Spratlin's side of the story. Before arriving Bulloch County Dispatch advised me that Mr. Spratlin had a warrant through Bulloch County but would not be held at the jail due to COVID-19.

Upon my arrival at the gas station, I spoke with Mr. Spratlin and Ms. Kline. Both stated that Mr. Lowery came to Mr. Spratlin's residence very irate demanding Ms. Kline to come do the dishes. Mr. Spratlin then stepped in saying that she didn't have to go do the dishes. Both Mr. Spratlin and Ms. Kline stated that Ms. Lowery threw a rock or a cork screw for a wine bottle at Mr. Spratlin. Mr. Spratlin stated that he did go to Ms. Lowery's residence where she was continuing to be irate. Mr. Spratlin stated, he left after Ms. Lowery said she was going to call law enforcement because he knew he had the warrant.

Both parties did not have any physical evidence or marking on there person's. They were advised of the magistrate court procedures and both parties were separating for the night. Nothing further.

**INCIDENT NARRATIVE:**

ON 07/23/2020 I SPOKE WITH BARBARA DAVIDSON AT THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN REFERENCE TO A SCAM.

DAVIDSON STATED THAT HE RECEIVED A PHONE CALL FROM A SUBJECT WHO STATED THAT THEY WERE WITH NORTH SHORE MED. AND THAT DAVIDSON WAS BEING CHARGED \$399.00 FOR PREVIOUS WORK. DAVIDSON WAS THEN ASKED TO PRESS ONE AND THEN ADVISED THAT IF HE DID NOT PRESS ONE HE WOULD BE CHARGED THE ABOVE STATED AMOUNT, PLUS AN ADDITIONAL \$300.00. DAVIDSON THEN PRESSED ONE AND SPOKE WITH A SUBJECT ON THE LINE AT A PHONE NUMBER OF 304-321-4315.

DAVIDSON THEN FOLLOWED INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE SUBJECT TO ALLOW HIM TO GAIN ACCESS TO HIS COMPUTER. ONCE THE SUBJECT GAINED ACCESS TO DAVIDSON'S COMPUTER, DAVIDSON WAS ADVISED THAT SOME REPAIRS WOULD BE DONE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF HIS COMPUTER.

THE SUBJECT THEN GAINED ACCESS TO DAVIDSONS WELLSFARGO BANKING ACCOUNT AND ADVISED DAVIDSON THAT HE WOULD NEED TO PAY A FEE OF \$500.00. DAVIDSON THEN ENTERED THE AMOUNT TO PAY THE SUBJECT. DAVIDSON QUICKLY REALIZED THAT THE AMOUNT HAD CHANGED TO \$5000.00 INSTEAD OF \$500.00. THE SUBJECT THEN ADVISED DAVIDSON THAT HE TYPED IN \$5000.00 AND SINCE IT WAS HIS MISTAKE THAT HE COULD NOT REVERSE IT.

THE SUBJECT THEN ADVISED DAVIDSON THAT IF HE WANTED HIS MONEY BACK, HE WOULD NEED TO PURCHASE TARGET GIFT CARDS TOTTALLING AN AMOUNT OF \$2000.00. DAVIDSON DROVE TO CVS PHARMACY AND PURCHASED \$2000.00 IN TARGET GIFT CARDS AND PROVIDE PHOTOS OF THE CARDS TO THE SUBJECT, TO WHICH HE DID.

THE SUBJECT THEN PLACED \$5000.00 BACK INTO DAVIDSONS ACCOUNT BUT ADVISED HIM THAT HE NEEDED TO WITHDRAW \$5000.00 IN CASH AND MAIL IT TO LIN ZHAG AT 25531 UNIVERSITY HAYWARD, CT 94542 VIA OVERNIGHT UPS.

THE SUBJECT THEN ADVISED DAVIDSON THAT HE WAS GOING TO PUT \$5,000.00 BACK INTO DAVIDSONS ACCOUNT. THE SUBJECT THEN HAD DAVIDSON'S NFCU ACCOUNT OPENED ON THE COMPUTER SCREEN AND ASKED FOR THE PASSWORD TO GAIN ACCESS SO THAT HE COULD PUT THE MONEY INTO THAT ACCOUNT. THE SUBJECT GAINED ACCESS TO DAVIDSONS OTHER ACCOUNT. THE SUBJECT THEN PUT THE MONEY INTO THE ACCOUNT AND ADVISED DAVIDSON THAT HE NEEDED TO PURCHASE FOUR ADDITIONAL TARGET GIFT CARDS IN THE AMOUNTS OF \$500.00 EACH AND THEN HE WOULD GET HIS MONEY BACK PLUS THE \$5000.00 THAT HE HAD PREVIOUSLY WITHDREW.

DAVIDSON WENT BACK TO CVS PHARMACY AND PURCHASED \$5000.00 IN TARGET GIFT CARDS AND PROVIDED THE INFORMATION ON THE CARDS TO THE SUBJECT.

DAVIDSON SOON REALIZED THAT HE WAS POSSIBLY THE VICTIM OF A SCAM. DAVIDSON HAS CONTACTED HIS BANKING INSTITUTIONS AND TARGET FRAUD DEPARTMENT AND ALL AGENCIES HAVE LAUNCHED AN INTERNAL INVESTIGATION. THIS REPORT IS DOCUMENTATION FOR DAVIDSON TO PROVIDE TO THE ABOVE LISTED AGENCIES. NOTHING FURTHER AT THIS TIME.

Ms. Lott stated, the truck was not hers and she was borrowing it from Robbie Blaire. She stated Mr. Blaire just purchased the vehicle. I ran the VIN number of the truck and Ms. Lott through GCIC and while waiting for a response I asked Ms. Lott if she would give me consent to search the vehicle. Ms. Lott then stated that it wasn't her vehicle so I could not search it. A K-9 deputy arrived on scene and the K-9 had a positive hit on the vehicle.

Myself and another deputy searched the vehicle. While searching the vehicle we found some drug related objects in the vehicle. I asked Bulloch County Dispatch to contact a female officer to come on scene to search Ms. Lott's person. Dispatch advised Brooklet Police Departments female officer's on duty was en route to the traffic stop. After searching the vehicle and before Brooklet PD arrived on scene, another deputy found a clear baggie sticking out of her pocket with a clear substance suspected to be meth and Ms. Lott pulled out a syringe with a needle out of her pocket. Brooklet PD arrived on scene and conducted a search. Brooklet PD did not find anything else on Ms. Lott.

Ms. Lott was then placed under arrest for the above stated charges and transported to the Bulloch County Jail. The vehicle and Ms. Lott's dog was released to the owner Mr. Blaire at her request. All evidence was turned over to CST investigator Smallegan. Nothing further.
