A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 13 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to granting of relief by superior courts, so as to provide for discretionary monitoring  
3 of the victim after the granting of a temporary protective order; to provide a definition; to  
4 provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and  
5 for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article 1 of Chapter 13 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
9 granting of relief by superior courts, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as  
10 follows:

11 "19-13-4.1.

12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'local law enforcement agency' means county  
13 and city:

14 (1) Police departments; and

15 (2) Sheriff offices.

16 (b)(1) Upon obtaining a protective order under Code Section 19-13-3 or 19-13-4, the  
17 petitioner may elect to request periodic security checks from any local law enforcement  
18 agency with jurisdiction in which the petitioner resides.

19 (2) Such security checks shall occur at intervals and times in the discretion of the local  
20 law enforcement agency and shall continue for the duration of the order or until such  
21 request is withdrawn by the petitioner or the local law enforcement agency determines  
22 that the petitioner's circumstances no longer appear to require such security checks.

23 (3) Security checks may include:

24 (A) Observation of the exterior of the petitioner's residence; and

25 (B) Officer presence in the vicinity of the petitioner's residence.

26 (4) If such petitioner elects to request such periodic security checks, the petitioner shall  
27 provide to the local law enforcement agency the temporary protective order for  
28 photocopying purposes and provide a written request for the law enforcement agency to  
29 conduct periodic security checks at the petitioner's residence contained in the protective  
30 order for a period of up to 60 days."

31 **SECTION 2.**

32 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
33 without such approval.

34 **SECTION 3.**

35 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
