ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

Creating the Senate Improving Access to Healthy Foods and Ending Food Deserts Study
 Committee; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, over two million Georgians, including 500,000 children, live in communities
4 that lack access to affordable fruits, vegetables, and other foods that contribute to a healthy
5 diet; and

6 WHEREAS, areas which lack access to affordable fruits, vegetables, and other foods that7 contribute to a healthy diet are called food deserts; and

8 WHEREAS, food deserts occur in both rural and urban communities; and

9 WHEREAS, food deserts are primarily located in low-income communities; and

10 WHEREAS, grocery stores are reluctant to locate in low-income communities; and

11 WHEREAS, rural areas face food deserts because of income levels but also because of the12 unique challenges in remote living; and

- 13 WHEREAS, all citizens of this state should have access to foods that are both affordable and
- 14 healthy; and

15 WHEREAS, study is needed to determine policy and legislative prescriptions for improving

16 access to healthy foods and ending food deserts.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

- 18 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Improving Access
- 19 to Healthy Foods and Ending Food Deserts Study Committee.

(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of five members of the
 Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President shall designate a
 member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.

- 23 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake to:
- 24 (A) Determine how many Georgians live in food deserts and where food deserts are25 located;
- 26 (B) Examine local, state, and national policies which address food deserts;
- 27 (C) Examine the economic impact food deserts have on this state's economy;
- 28 (D) Examine any changes that should be made to this state's tax and economic policies
- 29 to combat food deserts; and
- 30 (E) Examine how this state can assist local governments as they attempt to eradicate31 food deserts.
- 32 (4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 33 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 34 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- 35 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

36 (5) Allowances and funding. 37 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided 38 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. 39 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member 40 of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds 41 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds 42 appropriated to the Senate. 43 (6) **Report.** 44 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that 45 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the 46 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to 47 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph. 48 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for 49 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) 50 of this paragraph. 51 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 52 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. 53 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with 54 the Secretary of the Senate. 55 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary 56 of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof. 57 (7) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2021.
