GEORGIA SMALL BUSINESS WEEK

WHEREAS:

There are more than 1 million small businesses operating in Georgia. These businesses make up 99.8 percent of all businesses in the state and employ 1.6 million of its residents; and

WHEREAS:

The Georgia Centers of Innovation, the joint Economic Development Committee of the Senate and House of Representatives, the House Rural Development Council, the Senate Study Committee on Rural Georgia, and many others are committed to helping our businesses grow and creating new jobs within the state. They assist urban and rural communities alike to create and enhance local entrepreneurial ecosystems, exemplary workforce training, financial assistance programs, research, and technical assistance; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia provides a wide array of services to small businesses, including the Small Business Development Centers and access to resources and assistance programs like the Georgia State Small Business Credit Initiative.
