Re: October 2021 Financial Reports

Highlights for the General Fund revenues and expenditures are as follows:

- We have begun to see an increase in Property Tax payments to us from the Tax Commissioner's office. This will peak in December and then taper off in January until next fall. So far, collections have come in stronger than last year for the same time period, but it is too early to speculate on final collections.
- Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) As reported in last month's report, LOST collections continues to come in strong and above the amount budgeted.
- State QBE revenues are being collected as they were budgeted.
- Expenditures in the General Fund were in line as they were budgeted. As of October 31, 2021, we have completed 33.3% of the fiscal year and our year-to-date expenditures are at 32.6% of total budget.

### RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF BULLOCH COUNTY RECOMMENDING LOCAL LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH SCHOOL BOARD DISTRICT BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, the results of the 2020 decennial census have been released showing the voting constituency of the districts of the Bulloch County School District; and

WHEREAS, the results demonstrate that adjustments to the current board district's boundaries are necessary to bring the Bulloch County School District into compliance with the Equal Protection Clause of the US Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Georgia;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Education in a meeting assembled that:

- 1. The new district lines as shown on the attached maps labeled "BullochSB-Draft-2021", prepared with the assistance of the State Legislative and Congressional Reapportionment Office, be adopted.
- 2. The Secretary of the Board of Education is hereby authorized to certify this resolution to Senator Billy R. Hickman and Representatives Jan Tankersley, Butch Parrish and Jon Burns to assist them in obtaining local legislation from the Georgia General Assembly to implement this resolution, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 28-1-14.

# New Business To be placed on the table

**Descriptor Code: GARHB** 

The Bulloch County Board of Education shall make paid parental leave for qualifying life events equally available to all eligible employees under the following terms:

- 1. "Eligible employees" are defined as:
- (1) those employees of the Bulloch County Board of Education who are classified as full-time by the Bulloch County Board of Education, have at least six continuous months of employment with the Bulloch County Board of Education as of the date of the requested paid parental leave (or, in the case of employees paid on an hourly basis, have worked a minimum of 700 hours over the six-month period immediately preceding the requested paid parental leave), and are:
  - (a) a "public school teacher," "teacher," or "employee," meaning:
    - (i) a person employed not less than half time in a professionally certificated capacity or position in the Bulloch County public school system, or
    - (ii) a professionally certificated person who has acquired ten years or more of creditable service and who is being paid retirement benefits by the Teachers Retirement System of Georgia, Chapter 3 of Title 47, or by any other public school teacher retirement system in this state,
    - (iii) but excluding any emergency or temporary employees; or
  - (b) a "public school employee," meaning:
    - (i) a person employed by the Bulloch County Board of Education who is not eligible for membership in the Teachers Retirement System of Georgia or the Employees' Retirement System of Georgia (including, without limitation, school bus drivers, school lunchroom personnel, school maintenance personnel, and school custodial personnel, but excluding, without limitation, teachers or any school personnel who are now, or may hereafter become, covered by the Teachers Retirement System of Georgia or the Employees' Retirement System of Georgia, any person on the payroll of a third party with whom an employer has contracted for the provision of such person's services, or any person classified by an employer as other than a common law employee for federal tax purposes), or
    - (b) classroom aides, paraprofessionals, and noncertified administrative and clerical personnel,

8. Neither the Bulloch County Board of Education nor Bulloch County Schools shall discharge or in any other manner discriminate or retaliate against any eligible employee for lawfully exercising the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 45-20-17 or this Board policy. However, nothing shall prevent the Bulloch County Board of Education or Bulloch County Schools from taking an adverse employment action against an eligible employee who submits a false or fraudulent document or otherwise provides false or fraudulent information in an attempt to obtain paid parental leave under O.C.G.A. § 45-20-17 or this Board policy.

### Board Policy Teacher Evaluation Appeals

The appeal process described in this policy shall be available to teachers who have accepted a full-time, full school year contract with the Board of Education for the fourth or subsequent consecutive school year. Such teachers may appeal summative performance ratings of "Unsatisfactory" or "Ineffective" contained in personnel evaluations conducted pursuant to Code Section 20-2-210, procedural deficiencies on the part of the school system [or charter school] in conducting an evaluation, and job performance.

**Descriptor Code: GBIA** 

No more than 5 school days after the summative evaluation conference, the teacher shall provide a written notice of appeal to the responsible evaluator detailing every factual basis for the appeal. If the principal is the responsible evaluator, the principal shall respond in writing within 5 school days after the principal receives the appeal; if the responsible evaluator is not the principal, the appeal shall be forwarded to the principal, who shall conduct the first level of review. In either circumstance, a written response shall be provided to the teacher within 5 school days after the principal receives the appeal. The decision may be hand delivered to the teacher or sent by electronic mail.

If the teacher is dissatisfied with the principal's response, an appeal may be filed within 5 school days with a certified and TKES (Teacher Keys Evaluation System) trained administrator in the central office to be designated by the Superintendent (or in the discretion of the Superintendent, a qualified third party administrator from outside the District will be appointed). A written response shall be provided to the teacher within 5 school days of the appeal being received by the designated administrator. The decision may be hand delivered to the teacher or sent by electronic mail. The level two decision shall be final.

The appeal at either level must include a review of the complete evaluation record, including all documentation on the electronic platform, the original appeal and the response of the principal. In the discretion of the reviewer, a meeting may be scheduled with the teacher and, in the discretion of the reviewer, with the principal or original evaluator.

A teacher shall not be the subject of any reprisal as a result of filing an appeal under this policy. Any reprisal may be referred to the Professional Standards Commission.

This policy shall become effective on July 1, 2021.
