A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 11 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to public school property and facilities, so as to require local education agencies to 3 implement a mobile panic alert system capable of connecting disparate emergency services 4 technologies to ensure real-time coordination between multiple state and local first responder 5 agencies in the event of a school security emergency; to require the Department of 6 Administrative Services to administer a competitive solicitation for one or more vendors to 7 provide for such systems; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to 8 provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

11 This Act shall be known and may be cited as "Alyssa's Law."

12 SECTION 2.

13 Article 11 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to14 public school property and facilities, is amended by adding a new part to read as follows:

"Part 4

16 <u>20-2-590.</u>

- 17 (a) Not later than July 1, 2024, each local education agency, as that term is defined in Code
- 18 Section 20-2-167.1, shall implement a mobile panic alert system capable of connecting
- 19 disparate emergency services technologies to ensure real-time coordination between local
- 20 and state law enforcement and first responder agencies. Such system shall be known as the
- 21 <u>'Alyssa's Alert' and shall integrate with local public safety answering point infrastructure</u>
- 22 to transmit 911 calls and mobile activations.
- 23 (b) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a) of this Code section, each local
- 24 education agency may implement additional strategies or systems to ensure real-time
- 25 coordination between multiple first responder agencies in the event of a school security
- 26 <u>emergency.</u>
- 27 (c) Not later than December 1, 2023, the Department of Administrative Services shall
- 28 issue a competitive solicitation for one or more vendors to provide a system that satisfies
- 29 the requirements of subsection (a) of this Code section for use by local education agencies.
- 30 The Department of Administrative Services shall consult with the State School
- 31 Superintendent and the Governor's Office of Emergency Management prior to the
- 32 development of the competitive solicitation for such system."
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SECTION 3.

- 34 This Act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
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SECTION 4.

36 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
