Principles:

- Provide an easy-to-understand path for applicants and licensees
- Assure health, safety, and financial protections are there for Georgians
- Remove subjective criteria for application review
- Enforcement by boards as experts in the industry, focused on complaints and compliance
- Administrative processes for licensing and renewals, not reliant on board quorums, etc.
- Move to automated processes to remove human error and delay

Recommendations

Streamline the Process for Licensing – Reciprocity

- Increase opportunities for reciprocity for out-of-state licenses
- Follow Utah model for licensing foreign-trained professionals
 - License from their home country for which the education, experience, and testing requirements are substantially similar

Streamline the Process for Licensing - Modernization

- Electronic Continuing Education Tracker for all licenses that require CE
- Continued support for the GOALS licensing software rollout
- Establish direct electronic transfer of information where technology allows

Streamline the Process for Licensing - Administrative

- Provide administrative authority to Professional Licensing staff
- Increased support the Professional Licensing Division

Access to Licensing

- Criminal Record Preclearance
- Add a justification to each board in response to Georgia Supreme Court Decision to prove a legitimate government interest behind the regulation
